

Sports funding report 2016/17



The Use and Impact of Sports Premium at Princes School 2016/2017 (financial year)

Background:

The Government is providing additional funding for the financial year 2016/2017 to provide new, substantial primary school sport funding in order to improve the provision of physical education and sport in primary schools. This funding is being jointly provided by the Departments for Education, Health and Culture, Media and Sport, and will see money going directly to schools to be spent on improving the quality of sport and PE for all their children. All state-maintained schools, academies, middle schools, special schools and pupil referral units which have primary aged pupils (as reported in the Spring 2016 school census) will receive the funding.

This funding is ring-fenced and therefore can **only** be spent on provision for PE and sport in schools. We will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to

support pupils progress and participation in PE and school sport. We are required to publish on-line information about how we have used the additional funding, including details about our sporting provision alongside curriculum details. This will ensure that parents/carers and others are made fully aware of the PE and sporting provision at Princes.

Allocation:

All schools with 17 or more primary-aged pupils will receive a sum of £8,000 plus £5 per eligible pupil. The funding is provided in 2 separate payments.

For the financial year 16/17 we have received £8540.

How will we be spending the Sports Premium funding:

We believe in a holistic approach to the development of sport and physical activity for all, and encouraging collaboration and partnership working, to make the best use of resources and enhance PE and sport provision, in order to raise participation and achievement for all pupils. Princes is keen to ensure that the additional funding will improve the quality and breath of PE and sport provision. It is vital that any areas of support for PE and sport are clearly identified and that, where necessary, additional coaches are employed to work alongside the teaching staff. This collaborative working will ensure that teachers are highly skilled in delivering all aspects of the PE curriculum once the funding terminates.
